### **PROPOSAL**

Demolish the existing ca. 1946 house that is non-contributing to the historic district and construct a new house.

### PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS

The existing ca. 1946 house was the home of Granville Hamann, a gas company worker and a stationery salesman for Von Boeckmann-Jones. He and his wife lived here until around 1960. It has had a variety of renters and owners since that time, and does not have the requisite historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

The proposed new house for the site will be two stories with a combination of gables and shed roofs; the house will have a combination of wood siding and stucco, with aluminum-clad casement windows, a standing seam metal roof, and a concrete-framed front-facing garage with a metal clad garage door.


#### STANDARDS FOR REVIEW

The Old West Austin Historic District has no design guidelines for new construction. General design principles for new construction within historic districts encourage houses that are compatible in terms of size, scale, massing, and materials with the contributing houses within the district; historic district and Bryker Woods neighborhood design philosophies also recommend against front-facing garages.

## STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Although the existing house does not meet the criteria for designation as a historic landmark for its preservation, staff recommends using the style and massing of the existing house as a greater reference for the new construction proposed here. This section of Bryker Woods is typified by one-story, Colonial Revival-influenced houses; the existing house represents the character of the neighborhood, even though it was noted as non-contributing in the National Register District nomination (likely for the large additions to the rear). Staff recommends that the applicant reconsider the style of the proposed house and to use the character of the contributing houses within this section of the historic district as a strong guide in designing the new structure. A one-story presence on the street would be preferable to this two-story massing, and incorporation of more Colonial Revival-style elements into the new house would make it more compatible with the character of the historic district.

The applicant has met with the Bryker Woods Neighborhood Association in the intervening month, and has revised his plans to include more windows in the proposed house.

Granville A. Hamann appears in the 1940 U.S. Census as the 20-year old son of Henry and Augusta Hamann, farmers in Williamson County, Texas. Granville is listed as a Texas-born farm laborer; his parents owned their farm.

Granville A. Hamann, 71, of Austin, died Friday, April 12, 1991.

Mr. Hamann grew up in the Rice's Crossing Community and graduated from Taylor High School. He served four years in the United States Air Force during World War II. He worked for Von Boeckmann-Jones for 22 years. In 1985 he retired from Teacher Retirement System of Texas after 12 years of service. Mr. Hamann was an active member of St. Martin's Lutheran Church for 45 years and a member of Delwood Northeast Optimist Club for 26 years.

Funeral services will be held at 11:00 AM, Monday at St. Martin's Lutheran Church with Dr. James Bennett and Dr. Carl Schoss officiating. Interment will be in Capital Memorial Gardens. A visitation will be held Sunday, 6:00-8:00 PM at Cook-Walden Funeral Home.
