What is Safe Routes to School (SRTS)?

Safe Routes to School is an international movement with two basic goals:

- improve the safety conditions of routes to school
- encourage more children and families to bike or walk to school

What percentage of students use active transportation to get to school?




1969: 48% walked or biked, 12% driven


2009: 13% walked or biked, 44% driven

What makes a route safe?

- Low speed limits
- Low traffic volumes
- Presence of sidewalks
- Presence of bicycle facilities

- Well connected street grid
- Simpler symbol for "Quiet Street"
- Park Trails and Bridges provide key connections



Hill **Elementary**

- High speed limit roads
- Difficult crossings
- Bike/Ped
 facilities
 along busy
 roads
