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### Subject

### Additional Backup Information

Since 1995, the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) has been allocating federal funds to the City of Austin Health and Human Services Department (Health and Human Services) for the provision of comprehensive health screening services to newly arriving official refugees. Currently all services are provided with only grant funds.

DSHS has awarded Health and Human Services an additional \$13,900 for Fiscal Year 2014-2015, bringing the grant award to \$1,479,900. The number of official refugees served by the Refugee Clinic located in Austin, Texas increased by forty-six percent from July 2013 to July 2014. This increased funding through the Infectious Disease Intervention and Control Branch of the Texas Department of State Health Services will help meet the program's objectives of protecting, preventing, and monitoring the community for preventable diseases by providing vaccines, laboratory testing, translation services and health screening services for this high-risk population. Performance measures shall remain the same. The General Fund will not be required to contribute to this grant.
