


Current Weekly Service: Bagged Grass Clippings, Leaves, Small Branches

Residential Services Transitioning to food waste collection 2 cart service vs. 3 cart service



- FY2018-19 Conversion of 3 YT routes to 8 Organic routes
- FY2019-20 Conversion of 3 YT routes to 8 Organic routes
- Total of 32 weekly Organics Routes to service 210,600 Households

Curbside Organics Collection City-Wide Roll-Out Accommodate Alternatives

- Encourage Back-Yard Compositing
 Continue Rebates / Vouchers Program
- City Centralized Co-Mingled Collection
 Small collection container plus bags
- Community Service Programs
 - Alternative Organics Collection by Rule
 - Documentation of tonnage collected
 - Encourage community agriculture & gardens
 - Provide a replacement service that reduces carbon footprint and supports community
 - Requires Rules Adoption (see proposed rules)
