
Strong Academic Performance

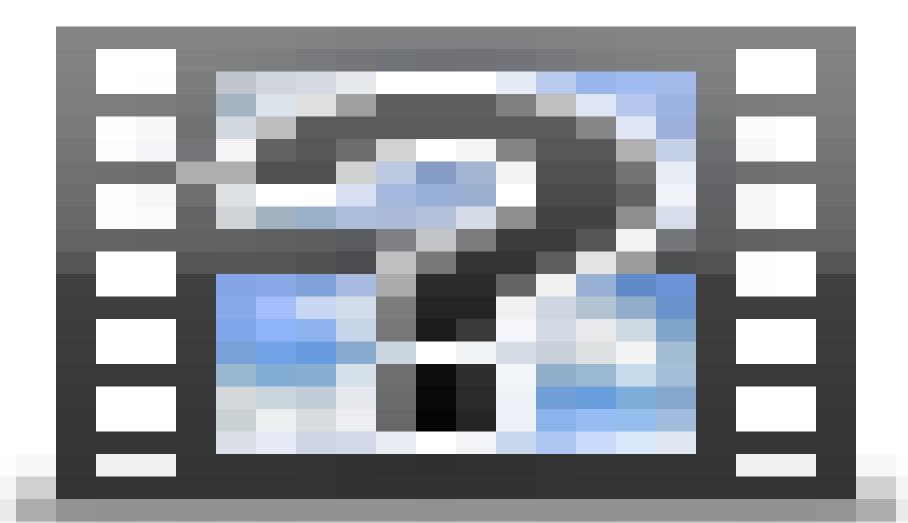
