PROPOSAL

Construct a second-story addition above the one-story section of the house.

PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS

The proposed addition will be approximately 625 square feet and will be constructed above the one-story section of the house, tying in to the two-story section to create a two-story presence on the street. The proposed addition will have board-and-bated siding to match that on the existing house and a composition shingle roof to match that on the existing house. The addition will have a window facing the front with a gabled pediment into the roofline similar to that on the two-story section of the house. The chimney will be extended to rise above the proposed addition.

STANDARDS FOR REVIEW


The Old West Austin National Register Historic District has no design guidelines for additions to contributing structures. General design principles recommend that new additions be placed on the rear of the house whenever possible, leaving the front façade intact, and using a scale, floor-to-ceiling height ratio, and materials complementary to the house and the other contributing structures within the district.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house was built in 1938 and was a rental property until the mid-1960s when it was purchased by Clem and Jackie Fain. Clem Fain had been a senior vice-president of Western Pipeline, which was one of Allen Shivers' business ventures. He and Jackie were retired by the time they moved into this house.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approve as proposed with the recommendation that the applicant consider a less ornate treatment for the new front-facing window on the second floor to better maintain the architectural integrity of the house. Staff recommends that the applicant complete a City of Austin Documentation Package consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center, prior to the release of the permit. Staff applauds the applicant for maintaining the integrity of the front porch in the one-story section of the house, but as in any project of this scope, advises against transforming a one-story house (or section of the house) into a two-story house.
