This contract will provide a supply of detectable warning plates for the Street and Bridge Division. Detectable warning surfaces were first required in 1973 in response to the requirements of the Rehabilitation Act and then Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) in 1990. Detectable warning surfaces are "A standardized surface feature built in or applied to walking surfaces or elements to warn of hazards on a circulation path" (ADA standards for Accessible Design 106.5, 2010). These are unique and standardized, intended to function much like a stop sign and to alert pedestrians who are visually impaired to the presence of a hazard in the line of travel. They consist of small truncated domes aligned in a square or radial grid pattern. The ADA Accessibility Guidelines and Standards require detectable warning surfaces on hazardous vehicle ways, transit platforms edges, and curb ramps. The cast iron detectable warning plates are permanently set into concrete during the construction of ADA ramps throughout the city.
