# HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION MARCH 23, 2015 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2015-0060 5400 SHOALWOOD AVENUE

### **PROPOSAL**

Demolish a ca. 1948 house.

### ARCHITECTURE

One-story, irregular-plan, side-gabled, frame house with a projecting front-gabled bay containing a paired set of 6:6 windows and a partial-width inset porch; other fenestration in the house consists of paired 6:6 and single 1:1 windows; front-gabled garage attached to the house via a breezeway.

#### RESEARCH


The house was built in 1948 by Douglas and Sadie Lou Ware. Douglas Ware was a building contractor, and built this house; his wife Sadie is listed as the owner of the property on the 1948 building permit. He was born in Stockdale, Texas, and was the son of a justice of the peace. They lived here until they divorced in 1976. The house was then owned and occupied by Neal Evans, II, a professor of astronomy at the University of Texas, who has specialized his research on the origins of stars and planets. He has taught at UT since 1975.

### STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and re-use if feasible; otherwise, release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

### **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES**

### Douglas B. and Sadie Lou Ware (ca. 1948 – ca. 1977)

Douglas B. and Sadie Lou Ware appear in the 1940 U.S. Census for Vineville, Bibb County, Georgia. Douglas B. Ware was 32, had been born in Texas, and was a construction contractor. Sadie Lou Ware was 30, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had 3 children: Maurice, 8; Thomas, 6; and Janice, an infant. All of the children except Janice had been born in Texas; Janice had been born in Georgia. The family had lived in Stockdale, Wilson County, Texas, in 1935.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Douglas B. Ware as the 22-year old son of B.J. and Lela E. Ware of Stockdale, Texas. Douglas was single, and the manager of a hatchery. His father was a justice of the peace. Douglas was the oldest of the Wares' 3 sons listed in the census report, and the only one of the sons with an occupation listed.

Douglas B. and Sadie Lou Ware were married in 1930 and divorced in 1976. He then married Myra Grantland in Bastrop County in 1977. He died in Bastrop County in 1981; his death certificate shows that he was born in 1907 in Texas, was married to Myra Grantland, and was a general contractor. He was living at Lake Bastrop at the time of his death.

WARE, Douglas Bartlette, 73, of Bastrop, died Thursday. Services 1:30 p.m. Sunday at Cook-Walden Funeral Home. Burial, Austin Memorial Park. Survivors: wife, Myra Ware of Lake Bastrop Estates; son, Melvin Ware of Austin; daughter, Janice Ware of Austin; brother, Thomas Ware of Waco.

### Neil J. Evans, II (ca. 1977 - )

Neil J. Evans is a professor of astronomy at the University of Texas.

**Neal J. Evans, II** has been a pioneer in the study of how stars form within this Galaxy and others. To recognize his outstanding and distinguished career, Prof. Evans' colleagues and former students will meet on the campus of The University of Texas at Austin, April 25-26, 2013, at ACES [map], to discuss the numerous advances he has made, placing them in context with our current understanding of star formation in the Universe.

### Dr. Neal J. Evans, II

Prof. Neal J. Evans, II has focused his research on the origins of stars and planets. He earned his bachelor's degree and doctorate in physics at the University of California, Berkeley and did a year and a half of post-doctoral work at Caltech. Although initially interested in high-energy and particle physics, he later became interested in astrophysics and worked with a research group started at Berkeley by Nobel laureate Charles Townes. Evans joined The University of Texas faculty in 1975, and teaches several astronomy courses there, including a class about the search for extraterrestrial life. One of his overarching goals in teaching is to share his interest in how things have come to be. For Evans, the journey is more important than the destination. Evans has worked with an international team of scientists that is using data from NASA's Spitzer Space Telescope to study the formation of low-mass stars and their accompanying planets. He also leads a team executing a large key project on the ESA Herschel Space Observatory and he is working with a team to map the plane of our Galaxy in the emission from dust at 1 mm. He is presently the Edward Randall, Jr. M.D. Centennial Professor in Astronomy for the Department of Astronomy at UT Austin.
