This project is the relocation of existing water, wastewater and reclaimed water lines located in conflict with the Texas Department of Transportation's (TXDOT's) State Highway 71 Toll Road Project from East of US 183 to Onion Creek - Toll Road Project.						
This project will relocate approximately 10632 linear feet of water lines, 8655 linear feet of wastewater lines, 3840 linear feet of reclaimed water, including 6", 8", 12", 16", 24", and 36" gate valves, fire hydrants, and all appurtenances. Construction is tentatively scheduled to begin in March 2015.						
Because of the potential for unknown subsurface conditions and utility conflicts when working in the right of way, a 10% contingency in funding has been included to allow for the expeditious processing of any change orders.
