No subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no goals were established for this solicitation. Additional Backup Information						

This contract will allow the Aviation Department to purchase, on an as needed basis, various parts for the shared use passenger processing system at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (ABIA). Currently airlines lease space at ABIA for their passenger processing (ticket counters) and arriving/departing planes (gate counters/jet-bridge). Because of the rapidly expanding air services the airport looked to technology to help manage these resources. A shared use passenger processing system allows the airport to manage those resources by installing specialized technology at ticket counters and gate positions, thus allowing any airline to use those resources. For example, one airline can log into 4 ticket counter positions to process passengers for their flight. When they are done and logged out, another airline could then use those same 4 ticket counters to process passengers for their flight.

This provides ABIA terminal flexibility by enabling 'any airline, any position, anytime' passenger processing capabilities. The system is used by every airline at ABIA and is a critical to the operation of the airport. This contract will allow ABIA to replace parts as needed to support the growth of the system. The parts include baggage tag/boarding pass printers, keyboards that allow the processing of credit cards/passports/drivers licenses, receipt printers and bar code readers.

Current airlines have announced additional flights from ABIA to other destinations starting in April 2015. With this forthcoming, the Aviation Department needs this contract in place before the new flights start service. This will allow ABIA to replace parts and to expand the shared use system at ABIA allowing the airlines to use the system to process passengers.
