## RESOLUTION NO.

WHEREAS, the City of Austin continuously seeks to protect and improve the quality of life of its residents; and

WHEREAS, the City of Austin is committed to safeguarding the public's health and safety; and

WHEREAS, smoke emissions from restaurants and mobile food vendors are not currently regulated by the City; and

WHEREAS, the City of Austin is committed to finding reasonable solutions to quality of life issues that balance the interests of residents and business owners; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

Council initiates an amendment to the City Code to require restaurants and mobile food vendors that utilize a wood or charcoal burning stove or grill located within 100 feet of the nearest property line of a property zoned as residential base district or property used for a residential use to take appropriate action to mitigate the impact of smoke emissions on the health and quality of life of surrounding residents by relocating smoke-emitting equipment to exceed the aforementioned distance or installing smoke-mitigating devices.

This requirement should exclude any restaurants and mobile food vendors that burn supplemental wood chips and chunks in stove-top box smokers using gas-powered stoves or grills that do not generate a significant amount of smoke.

## BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

The City Manager is directed to initiate a stakeholder input gathering process to provide an opportunity for affected residents, and business owners to provide recommendations and to incorporate these recommendations into the draft ordinance.

## BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

The City Manager is directed to present the proposed ordinance and associated 2 consent the recommendations consistent with this resolution to the Planning Commission and the Planning and Neighborhoods Committee of Council for consideration no later than May 21, 2015.
