PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1946 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled stuccoed frame house with a front-gabled bay on the right side of the principal block, and a front-gabled projecting entry bay containing a recessed front door; side-gabled addition to the left side of the principal block; 6:6 and 8:8 Colonial Revival-styled fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house was built in the winter of 1945-46. The first owners and occupants of the house were Wynn and Ruby Good, who lived here until around 1948. Wynne Goode was the administrative officer for the American Legion. From around 1948 to around 1957, the house was owned and occupied by Fieldon and Dorothy Berry. Berry grew up in Lampasas County farm, but became a clerk and examiner for the IRS for the time that he and Dorothy lived in this house. From the mid-1950s through the early 1960s, the house was owned and occupied by F.F. and Margaret E. Everett. Everett was the education director for the Kinney Avenue Baptist Church, and constructed the side addition in 1961 as his study.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and re-use if feasible; the house, while not qualifying as a historic landmark, has the typical minimal traditional style that defines this area of South Austin, and the applicant should seriously consider alternatives to demolition that would maintain the existing style and scale of the house and neighborhood. If the Commission votes to release the permit, then staff recommends the completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center, prior to release of the permit.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Wynne and Ruby Goode (ca. 1946 – ca. 1948)

Wynne and Ruby Goode appear in the 1940 U.S. Census as the renters of an apartment at 1302 San Jacinto Boulevard in Austin. Wynne Goode was 40, had been born in Texas, and was a service officer for the American Legion. Ruby Goode was 26, had been born in Texas, and was a stenographer for the State Education Department. They had no children listed with them. According to his 1962 death certificate, Wynne S. Good was born in Alpine, Texas in 1899. He was an administrative assistant for the U.S. Department of Agriculture, and had lived in Dallas for 15 years at the time of his death.

Fieldon and Dorothy Berry (ca. 1948 – ca. 1957)

Fieldon Berry appears in the 1940 U.S. Census as the 15-year old son of H.C. and Esta Berry of Lampasas County, Texas. He had been born in Texas, as had his parents. His father was a farmer; Fieldon had no occupation listed.

Fieldon Berry, 86, of Manchaca, peacefully passed away at his home on Monday, March 28, 2011. He was born on October 12, 1924 in Lampasas County, TX to Clarence and Esta Mae Berry.

Fieldon is survived by his loving wife of 63 years, Dorothy M. Berry; son, Wayne Berry and wife Beverly; daughter, Sharon Tisdale and husband Jim Rowe; daughter, Rachel Halliburton and husband Billy; grandchildren, Cory, Brittany, Megan, Laura, Jamie and Amanda; great grandchildren, Stetson, Kailey, Justin, Christopher, Shayla and Archer and numerous other family members and friends.
