Additional Backup Information

Under the Gas Utilities Regulatory Act (Chapters 101 through 105 of the Texas Utilities Code) ("GURA"), the City has original jurisdiction over gas utility rates set for customers within its city limits. Atmos has approximately 8,228 customers in the City of Austin.

The City Charter requires Council to hold a public hearing prior to taking any action that affects rates of a natural gas franchise holder.

On February 28, 2014, ATMOS initiated a ratemaking proceeding with Austin and the other cities in the coalition known as the "ATMOS Texas Municipalities" (ATM) by submitting an application to increase its revenue by about \$45.6 million, an increase of about 9.2% in annual base-rate revenue. On May 22, 2014, the City denied the rate increase, and Atmos appealed the denial to the Railroad Commission where in late April, 2015 an appeals examiner recommended approval of a \$42.9 million increase.

On February 27, 2015, Atmos submitted an application under the current RRM to Austin and the other ATM cities seeking an additional system-wide rate increase of \$28.7 million ("2015 RRM"), which equates to an increase of about 5.6%.

After extensive review and negotiations with Atmos, ATM's special counsel advises the ATM cities to accept a settlement increasing rates by about \$21.87 million over the current, interim rates Atmos is charging. Because the current rates Atmos is charging have not been approved by either the cities or the Railroad Commission, the City's action in effect would be to approve an increase for the 2014 RRM filing and the 2015 RRM filing of about \$65.7 million, combined, over Atmos' 2013 proposed revenues.

The combined increases for the 2014 RRM and 2015 RRM are shown below.

An increase of about \$21.87 million over the rates Atmos is *currently* charging related to the 2015 RRM, represents an increase of about 4%, and the impact on an average customer's bill would be as follows:
