service customers will increase by \$4.73, (3.3%), and large volume general service customers will see an increase of \$28.16, (1.38%).

The City has the option to suspend the implementation date of the interim charge by 45 days. Staff recommends a 45day suspension to allow City staff time to review the filing with its rate consultant and prepare a recommendation. Staff anticipates providing its recommendation to the Public Utilities Council Committee at their June meeting and to the City Council in mid-June.
