Authorize award and execution a 24-month contract with UNIFILT CORPORATION for the purchase of anthracite filter material for Austin Water in an amount not to exceed \$191,552, with two 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$95,776 per extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$383,104.

Amount and Source of Funding

Funding in the amount of \$7,981 is available in the Fiscal Year 2014 – 2015 Operating Budget of Austin Water. Funding for the remaining 23-months of the initial contract period and extension options are contingent upon funding in future budgets.

There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

Additional Backup Information				

The contract will provide Austin Water with a readily available supply of anthracite filter material that will be purchased on an as needed basis and delivered to the Davis Water Treatment Plant and Walnut Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant. The anthracite filter materials will be used to remove suspended particulate matter from the water as a part of the treatment process.

The Environmental Protection Agency and The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality require filtration as part of drinking water treatment. The wastewater needs to be filtered to be suitable for reuse. The product being supplied complies with the American Water Works Association Standard B100 and the Nation al Sanitation Foundation Standard 61 for indirect additives.

PRICE ANALYSIS

- a. Adequate competition.
- b. 88 notices were sent, including one MBE and two WBE firms. Six bids were received, with no response from the MBE/WBEs. Two "NO BID" responses were received.
- c. The pricing offered represents an approximate 5% decrease from the previous contract awarded September 2011.

This has been determined as a fair price since there has been a 10% increase in the cost for processed anthracite.

- b. Unifilt Corporation is not the current provider of the product.
- c. The Purchasing Office concurs with the Austin Water Utility's recommended award.d. Advertised in the Austin American Statesman and on the internet.
