Authorize award and execution of a 24-month contract through the Texas Local Government Purchasing Cooperative (BuyBoard) Program with DUKE’S ROOT CONTROL INC. for the purchase and application of root control for treatment of wastewater mains in an amount not to exceed \$150,000.					
Amount and Source of Funding					
Funding in the amount of \$25,000 is available in the Fiscal Year 2014 – 2015 Operating Budget of Austin Water. Funding for the remaining 20-months of the initial contract period is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

Additional Backup Information					

The contract is to purchase and apply Razorooter II root control to approximately 55,941 linear feet of Austin Water's wastewater mains annually. Razorooter II is the only root control treatment product that we are aware of that has been subject to extensive testing and received approval for not having an adverse effect to the environment or biology and that has been tested and approved for use in wastewater lines by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and Texas Structural Pest Control Board.

When tree roots grow inside wastewater lines there is the potential of clogging the lines and causing wastewater overflows. Applying a chemical treatment to the tree roots growing in wastewater mains is a preventative measure to help reduce sanitary sewer overflows. Razorooter II root control has previously been purchased on an annual basis through sole source spot purchases.
