#### **Summary of Discussion**

Staff briefed the Committee on additional staff recommendation information of decibel limits and comparisons with other cities.

#### **Public Comments**

Rich Szecsy, represent the concrete producers/suppliers: spoke on issues of pouring during heavy traffic hours. If you have a law in downtown Austin that state no stacking trucks until 7:00 and complete pouring at by 11:00, you force us to do daytime pours and through the heat of the day.

Tom Woods, spoke on pouring during the heat of the day and past 7:00 p.m. their drivers are out of hours. Drivers are only allowed to drive a maximum of 15 hours per day by law. These are critical issues that should be discussed as well as these times will cause the tracks to be in traffic and more congestion in downtown Austin.

Barry Lewis, Member of the Board of the Downtown Neighborhood Association: spoke on specific circumstances that do require overnight and round-the-clock pours and Mat slabs are one.
