

AUSTIN CITY COUNCIL MINUTES

SPECIAL CALLED MEETING THURSDAY, JUNE 25, 2015

The following represents the actions taken by the Austin City Council in the order they occurred during the meeting. While the minutes are not in sequential order, all agenda items were discussed. The City Council of Austin, Texas, convened in a special called meeting on Thursday, June 25, 2015 in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 301 West Second Street, Austin, Texas.

Mayor Adler called the Council Meeting to order at 11:33 a.m. Council Member Houston was absent.

CONSENT AGENDA

There was no item 1.

2. Approve an ordinance amending City Code Chapter 15-9 regarding utility deferred payment agreements. **This item was approved by Council on Tuesday, June 23, 2015.**

Item 3 was pulled for discussion.

4. Authorize negotiation and execution of an amendment to the professional services agreement with FOUND DESIGN LLC, dba MERJE, to provide design services for the Austin Downtown Wayfinding System in the amount of \$144,324 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$463,478. (Notes: This contract was awarded in compliance with City Code Chapter 2-9B Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program by meeting the goals with 21.08% MBE and 21.96% WBE participation to date.)

This item was approved by Council on Tuesday, June 23, 2015.

5. Approve an ordinance vacating approximately 4,646 square feet of an unnamed street located between South 1st Street and South 2nd Street (adjacent to 900 South 1st Street); approximately 5,996 square feet of South 2nd Street; and approximately 2,184 square feet of an alley north of Copeland Street, between South 1st Street and South 2nd Street, to 1ST STREET HIGHLANDS, LP, for the appraised value of \$137,838, subject to retaining public utility easements and a waterline easement, dedication of public access easements, relocation of utilities at the developer's expense, and concurrent dedication by plat of new right-of-way (District 9).

Approve a resolution concerning renaming the Quick Start Tennis Courts at the Austin Tennis Center, located at 7800 Johnny Morris Road and repealing Resolution No. 20150507-008.

Authorize award and execution of a 60-month revenue contract with ALLEN CLICK to provide the cutting, baling, and sale of hay, and the harvest and sale of pecans for Austin Water for an estimated revenue of \$305,000, with one 60-month extension option with an estimated revenue of \$305,000, for a total estimated revenue amount of \$610,000.

This item was approved by Council on Tuesday, June 23, 2015.

10. Authorize award, negotiation and execution of a 36-month contract with LAPTOPSANYTIME to provide a laptop and tablet kiosk distribution system for the Austin Public Library in an amount not to exceed \$85,361, with two 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$7,437 each, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$100,235. (Notes: This contract will be awarded as a sole source and is exempt from City Code Chapter 2-9D Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program.)

 Authorize award, negotiation, and execution of a 12-month social services contract with the COUNCIL ON AT-RISK YOUTH to operate of a juvenile justice youth program for the Police Department in an amount not to exceed \$128,000.

Authorize award and execution of five contracts through the Texas Local Government Purchasing Cooperative (Buyboard) for light duty vehicles and equipment with CALDWELL COUNTRY CHEVROLET DBA BABY JACK II AUTOMOTIVE, LTD. in an amount not to exceed \$1,915,979; DEERE & COMPANY in an amount not to exceed \$106,717; GRAPEVINE DODGE CHRYSLER JEEP, LLC DBA GRAPEVINE DCJ, LLC in an amount not to exceed \$3,029,838; SILSBEE FORD, INC. in an amount not to exceed \$2,756,457; and WIRTGEN AMERICA in an amount not to exceed \$458,301, for a total amount not to exceed \$8,267,292. (Notes: This cooperative contract will be awarded in compliance with City Code Chapter 2-9D Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise

Procurement Program. No subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no goals were established for this contract.)

(Notes: This contract will be awarded in compliance with City Code Chapter 2-9C Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program. Per the City's Small and Minority Resources Department, no subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no goals were established for this solicitation.) 22. Approve a resolution directing the City Manager to create, for purposes of public access, an online system consisting of a downloadable and searchable database, capable of standard querying, for campaign finance filings.

Resolution No. 20150625-022 was approved on Council Member Pool's motion, Mayor Adler's second on a 10-0 vote. Council Member Houston was off the dais.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

The City Council went into Executive Session, pursuant to Chapter 551 of the Texas Government Code, to receive advice from Legal Counsel, to discuss matters of land acquisition, litigation, and personnel matters as specifically listed on this agenda and to receive advice from Legal Counsel regarding any other item on this agenda.

24. Discuss process for evaluating Council appointees.
 The presentation was made by Mark Washington, Director of the Human Resources Department.

ITEM(S) REFERRED FROM COUNCIL COMMITTEE(S) CONTINUED

21. Approve third reading of an ordinance amending City Code Chapters 15-2 and 15-9 relating to the drainage charge. (THE PUBLIC HEARING FOR THIS ITEM WAS HELD AND CLOSED ON MAY 21, 2015).

There was a motion made by Council Member Kitchen and seconded by Council Member Zimmerman to approve the ordinance.

There was an amendment made by Council Member Kitchen and seconded by Council Member Zimmerman to amend Part 6, Section 15-2-7 by adding a new Subsection C to read, "(C) After computing the monthly drainage charge as described in subsections (A) and (B), the monthly drainage charge for single family residential properties may be modified by limiting any increase in the charge to be assessed October 1, 2015 – October 1, 2016 as compared to the charge assessed October 1, 2015 by a percentage, if established by separate ordinance."

The amendment passed on a vote of 10-0. Council Member Houston was absent.

There was an amendment made by Council Member Kitchen and seconded by Council Member Zimmerman to read as follows. The amendment passed on a vote of 9-0. Mayor Adler was off the dais. Council Member Houston was absent.

The amendment was to add a new Subsection (C) to Part 4, Section 15-2-5 and renumber and amend Part 9, Section 15-2-12 as follows.

"Part 4, Section 15-2-5,

C) The percentage of impervious cover on a benefitted property may be calculated on a composite basis with another benefitted property if:

- (1) The properties together constitute a condominium regime; or
- (2) The properties were legally developed together as one site as evidenced by a unified development agreement, city site plan, or other acceptable documentation.
- "Part 9, Section 15-2-10 Annual Report

The director shall provide an annual report of the drainage utility revenues, expenses, and programs to the city council. The annual report shall include findings on the impact of green infrastructure on drainage and recommended strategies that could allow utility customers to reduce the drainage charge by reducing their property's impact on drainage. The recommended strategies shall address the potential for credits or discounts for innovative stormwater controls that exceed land development requirements and/or detention and water quality treatment minimum requirements."

There was an amendment made by Council Member Zimmerman and seconded by Council Member Kitchen to amend Section 15-2-15 by striking sections B, C and D. The amendment was later withdrawn by Council Member Zimmerman.

There was an amendment made by Council Member Zimmerman and seconded by Council Member Troxclair to amend Section 15-2-7 by adding a new subsection (D) to read, "(D) After computing the monthly drainage charge as described in subsections (A) and (B), the monthly drainage charge for single family residential properties may be modified by establishing tiers that cluster properties according to the amount of the calculated charge for each, and a single uniform charge may be set for each tier if established by separate ordinance." The amendment failed on a vote of 1-8. Council Member Zimmerman voted aye. Mayor Adler was off the dais. Council Member Houston was absent.

Ordinance No. 20150625-021 was approved with the following amendments listed above on Council Member Kitchen's motion, Council Member Zimmerman's second on a 9-0 vote. Mayor Adler was off the dais. Council Member Houston was absent.

PUBLIC HEARINGS AND POSSIBLE ACTIONS

25. Conduct a public hearing and consider an appeal by Daniel Llanes, regarding the Planning Commission's approval of a variance from City Code Section 25-2-721(B)(1), which prohibits the construction of a building or parking area within the primary setback of the Waterfront Overlay in the Red Bluff Subdistrict (District 3).

This item was postponed to August 13, 2015 on Council Member Zimmerman's motion, Council Member Renteria's second on a 9-0 vote. Mayor Adler was off the dais. Council Member Houston was absent.

Mayor Pro Tem Tovo adjourned the meeting at 4:06 p.m. without objection.
