The contract will provide the Parks and Recreation Department (PARD) with a consultant to assist in the development of a master plan for the City to guide the current usage and future development of public swimming pools and related facilities.

The construction of aquatic facilities in Austin began in the early 1930's were intended to operate for approximately 50 years. Today, most facilities are either approaching, or have exceeded their forecasted operating life span. A strategic assessment of the aquatic facilities was completed recently. The assessment focuses on inspection, evaluation and made recommendations for renovation, redevelopment and/or replacement with new facilities on existing or alternative sites. Based on the results of the assessment, it is necessary to expand on the findings by developing a master plan for the aquatic facilities citywide.

The master plan will focus on approximately 40 aquatic facilities. The consultant will be tasked to recognize facility management opportunities and develop recommendations on the current, expanded or reduced aquatic facility system. The recommendations will be based on national best practices, environmental sustainability, aquatic health codes, program fiscal efficiencies, and regional characteristics.

This request allows for the development of a contract with a qualified offeror that Council selects. If the City is unsuccessful in negotiating a satisfactory contract with the selected offeror, negotiations will cease with that provider. Staff will return to Council so that Council may select another qualified offeror and authorize contract negotiations with this provider.

A team of PARD personnel with aquatic facility expertise evaluated and scored the proposals and recommended Brandstetter Carroll to carry out this project. Evaluation criteria included proposed approach and program, demonstrated applicable experience, personnel qualifications, local business presence, and evaluated cost.

Developing a master plan is a priority for PARD, with the historical and cultural qualities of the existing facilities providing an opportunity to enhance the City's aquatic program from a geographical, environmental, and recreational perspective. Completion of the master plan is contingent on Council approval this fiscal year.
