PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1947 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side gabled frame house with a partial-width, partially-insent porch on ornamental metal posts; single 1:1 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built over the winter of 1946-1947. The first owner and occupant of the house was Annye I. Blum, a widow who worked as a saleslady in a children's clothing store, and later as a saleslady in the baby clothing department at Yaring's. She had her husband had moved to Austin in 1943; her husband, a former chief of the Hillsboro (Tex.) Fire Department, died in 1944. In the late 1950s, she married Roger Dennis, a former railroad switchman who became a watchman at Scarbrough's before his retirement. After Roger Dennis passed away in 1972, Annye continued living here until around 1980. She died in 1987.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house does not appear in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Consider relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.
