If approved, funding will be provided for a one-year contract with the Austin Area Urban League (AAUL). Services to be provided by AAUL under the contract include: responding to client requests for repairs, verifying client eligibility, developing specifications for repairs, facilitating repairs, using licensed contractors and other skilled tradespersons, and providing quality assurance for the work performed. The cost of repairing any one home under this program shall not exceed \$5,000 per fiscal year. The contract term shall be from October 1, 2015, to September 30, 2016. The Emergency Home Repair (EHR) Program provides emergency and critical repairs to owner-occupied housing							
located in the City of Austin. The program addresses potentially life-threatening health and safety issues and helps preserve existing housing stock. The homeowners assisted by this program must reside in the home, and their total household incomes cannot exceed 80 percent of the Austin Area Median Family Income (currently \$61,450 for a family of four). A total of 417 unduplicated households will be served. The assistance provided by this program is in the form of a grant to the homeowner. The EHR program has been in existence for over thirty years.
