## Additional Backup Information

This action will authorize the negotiation and execution of an interlocal agreement with Texas State University – San Marcos to reimburse costs for law enforcement activity under the Texas Tobacco Enforcement Program for a total reimbursement not to exceed \$28,650. All law enforcement activity under this agreement will target Austin tobacco retailers and the potential for and/or suspected sale of tobacco products to minor age consumers. Activity will include approximately 380 controlled buys and stings for the time period of September 1, 2015 – August 31, 2016. This is the fourth year APD will receive a contract for tobacco enforcement from Texas State University. During the 2014 calendar year, officers filed 252 cases for the charge of underage possession of tobacco and issued 11 citations for the sale of tobacco to minors. Ten police officers are currently trained to perform tobacco controlled buys/stings. At any given time, 10 minor participants are trained and ready to assist with stings.
