Additional Backup Information							

Prior to 2012, Austin Energy transferred funds to AHFC to administer the repair and rehabilitation services program for eligible households burdened by the former Holly Power Plant. The services are provided by experienced nonprofit organizations that assist homeowners to address the twenty-nine health and safety hazards identified in the Healthy Home Rating System, including allergy and asthma.

The purpose of the Holly Good Neighbor Program is to address substandard housing conditions of low and moderate income homeowners residing within the Holly service area. The program provides up to \$20,000 of assistance per home in the form of a grant. This amount does not include any other assistance the participant organization may provide to the homeowner through other programs it offers.

The program will assist households with a total household income at or below 100% of the Area Median Family Income, currently \$76,800 for a four-person household. Each homeowner receiving assistance through this program must occupy the home, and it must be the owner's homestead. The homeowner must also provide proof that s/he or an immediate family member owned the property beginning no later than 2000.

AHFC issued the \$1.2 million Holly Good Neighbor Program Notice of Funding Ability (NOFA) on July 27, 2015. A pre-submittal meeting was held on August 3, and applications were due by August 10, 2015. Six non-profit organizations submitted applications for the NOFA, and all six non-profits met the requirements to be accepted into the program.
