

This project consists of the renovation of approximately 2 ½ acres (100,000 square feet) of existing parkland for the development of a multi-purpose, natural grass playfield. The existing parkland area is generally flat, well-drained, publicly accessible, and free of trees or other surface development. Work would include site stripping and rough grading, soil amendment, fine grading, the provision of an underground, automated irrigation system, sod placement (hybrid Bermuda grass for sports fields), and a period of where the turf grows in and gets established. Indirect project costs include environmental controls, project design and project management costs. The resulting improvement will provide a resilient, safe, and sustainable play surface for a variety of field sports, including football. The field location is linked to other park uses, parking areas, and public rights-of-way by existing walking paths.

The field is located at Dove Springs Recreation Center in the 78744 zip code of Austin. The Dove Springs Recreation center already has a viable flag football program participating in the undeveloped field that is being considered for improvements. The development of this field space would provide southeast Austin with a safe and maintained space for football programming.

This project will not be just a one-time impact. The Parks and Recreation Department (PARD) would maintain this field and design programs to take place on this field for generations to come. PARD will use the proposed field as a hub in South Austin for football games, practices, and camps. PARD seeks to improve the quality of life of our participants through intentionally structured programs, one of those programs being football.
