## PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1938 house.

## ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, front-gabled frame house with a front-gabled, independent entry hood on plain, square wood posts; single and paired 1:1 fenestration.

### RESEARCH

The house was built in 1938 as a rental property. The first tenant was Thomas G. Little, who lived here for about a year. He had no occupation listed in the city directory. James and Eula Pittsford rented the house in the early 1940s; he was a plumber. From around 1943 until around 1950, the house was rented by Ernest and Estelle Wagner; he was in the U.S. Army at the time he and Estelle rented the house, but was a furniture finisher by trade. He had worked as furniture finisher for Kutalek Art Cabinets prior to renting this house; he was working for the J.R. Reed Music Company as a refinisher while living in this house.

From around 1950 to around 1965, the house was rented by Elroy and Willie Alexander. Elroy Alexander was employed by the City Sanitation Division. From the mid-1960s through the late 1970s, the house was associated with members of the Rangel family. Joe Rangel was a laborer for a paving company and later a serviceman for the Kerrville Bus Company.

## STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any City survey.


#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION
