Recommendation

- Purchasing and SMBR must review all procurements for subcontracting opportunities
- Commodities should be scrutinized for subcontracting opportunities
- Procurement opportunities shall be broken into smaller packages
- Contract terms shall be decreased from three years to one year. Term reduction decreases total contract price and makes contract affordable for M/WBE firms to bid.
- Solicit bids from certified M/WBE firms
- Review modifications of M/WBE certification

Description of Recommendation to Council

When procuring commodities:

- Find subcontracting opportunities (supplier and trucking).
- Break down larger contracts.
- Pass through compliance (contract monitoring / compliance).
- No bids received from certified M/WBE minority firms
- Goals should not be a based upon a minimum of three M/WBE availability, but should be changed to a 1:1 ratio. If subcontracting opportunities are identified and the Purchasing Office or SMBR can only find one or two or three M/WBEs, then a goal shall be set. If no M/WBE bids the project, the City is protected under the Ordinance by making Good Faith Effort to include M/WBE participation.
- Contracts should be awarded on availability and not quantitative limitations.
- Purchasing does not incur any additional cost; the prime looks for subcontracting opportunities and bids accordingly.

Rationale:

• Regarding item 20 on the October 1st, 2015 Austin City Council meeting, Authorize execution of a 36-month contract with COMMUNITY TRUCKING LLC to provide crushed rock in an amount not to exceed \$993,603, with three 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$331,201 per extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,987,206, there were no goals set or multiple award processes for this commodity procurement. The City of Austin Purchasing Office procured crush stone from a non-minority contractor and did not identify any M/WBE subcontracting opportunities. No bids were received from certified M/WBE firms. Purchasing and SMBR did not break out the crushed granite procurement into smaller packages.
