HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION DECEMBER 14, 2015 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2015-1079 2202 ROSEWOOD AVENUE

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1934 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with a central, partial-width, frontgabled independent porch on plain, Square wood posts; single 1:1 fenestration; one-story, rectangular-plan, shed-roofed addition to the rear.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built in 1934 by Earl Simms, a local real estate developer who owned many rental houses in East Austin. Becker Lumber Company was the contractor for the construction of the house.


The house was rented by George and Maud Fletcher, an African-American couple. George Fletcher had grown up on a farm near Manor where his father was a farm laborer. By 1930, he was married to Maud and living at the home of a relative at 1706 Rosewood Avenue and working as a brick mason. He and Maud moved into this house as renters in 1934; he lived here off and on for the rest of his life. He was a chauffeur for a private family in the early 1940s, then went to work as a janitor at the Post Office, a position he held until the early 1960s. His wife is listed as Erma in the 1940 U.S. Census and in the 1941 city directory; in the mid-1940s, he was again living at 1706 Rosewood for a short period of time, and was married to a woman named Estella, who stayed with him for the rest of his life. In the mid-1960s, he worked as a yardman for the Scottish Rite Dormitory. After his death in 1985, Estella Fletcher continued to reside in this house.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is listed in the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984) but without a priority for research.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house represents a typical rent house in East Austin built by developers for the African-American community, but has insufficient architectural or historical significance in and of itself to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

George Fletcher (ca. 1934 – ca. 1985)

George and Erma Fletcher appear in the 1940 U.S. Census as the owners of this house, which was worth \$1,200. George Fletcher was 34, had been born in Texas, and was a chauffeur for a private family. Erma Fletcher was 26, had been born in Texas, and was a public school teacher. They had 2 children: Bernice, 12; and James, 9. Both children had been born in Texas.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows George C. and Maud Fletcher living with a relative, James Gould, at 1706 Rosewood Avenue. George Fletcher was 24, had been born in Texas, and was a brick mason. Maud E. Fletcher was 21, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a daughter, Bernice, 2.

The 1920 U.S. Census shows George Fletcher as the 13-year old son of Sandy and Maggie Fletcher of rural Manor, Texas. Sandy Fletcher was a farm laborer; George Fletcher had no occupation listed. He was the 2nd of the 5 children of Sandy and Maggie Fletcher.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Horace Walker as the 14-year old nephew of Thomas Francis, who owned his house in Precinct 3 of Travis County. Horace Walker was a student in the junior high school. His uncle, Thomas Francis, was a roofer. Horace's older sister, Rose, also lived in the household. She was a student at Anderson High School.

FLETCHER, George, 79, of Austin died Monday. Services 2 p.m. Saturday at Simpson United Methodist Church. Buriai Evergreen Cemetery. (King Tears)
