ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: This is one of the city co-sponsored special events per Resolution No. 021003-40, as amended by Resolution No. 20050324-040B. In summary, the total fee waivers authorized for this event are estimated at \$180,593. Additionally, the Austin Transportation Department refundable security deposit requirement of \$2,000 and the Parks and Recreation Department refundable damage deposit requirements of \$1,000 are also being waived.

Waiving fees for this event results in unrealized revenue for the following funds and departments: Mobility Fund, Austin Transportation Department; Economic Development Fund, Economic Development Department; and the General Fund, Parks and Recreation, Development Services and Health and Human Services Departments. Although budgeted revenue for fees is based upon historical data and not necessarily upon specific events, the waiver of these fees reduces potential revenues that could be realized.
