Mr. Derr said these amendments will help level the playing field for all ground transportation providers and will provide better mobility and enhanced safety for everyone. The issue of insurance will be discussed at a later date, when Risk Management staff with the City of Austin is available.

Council Member Don Zimmerman expressed concerns about TNC companies providing data. Mr. Derr and Chair Kitchen said the request for information was comparable to what other private for-hire-vehicle companies report and that the information is simply to help transportation staff to do their job. Chair Kitchen also said any data reports would be subject to laws with regard to proprietary information.

Public Comments:

- Lyft representative Jed Bowie said the company would like a better idea of how the data would be used to better Austin's transportation network.
- Uber representative Adam Blinick said he would also like to work with City staff to develop datasharing provisions.
