Additional Backup Information					

Originally constructed in 1953, the Davis Water Treatment Plant is the critical component of the Austin potable water system, producing potable water for the central, east and north parts of the city. Key functions at the plant are performed by original assets that are far beyond their expected useful life including the power distribution system and the medium service pump station, which delivers the finished water to the distribution system. This project has been scoped and scheduled to renew and improve these integral plant processes with minimal disruption to facility operations, thus significantly extending the useful life of a facility that is a cornerstone of the water system.

This project will demolish the old medium service pump station and construct a new medium service pump station while maintaining potable water service to City users with minimal impact to the surrounding neighborhood. The project is expected to begin in June 2016 and be substantially complete in February 2020.

Public communication to the affected areas has been continuous through a combination of meetings, mailings and an informational website.

A delay in execution of this project could adversely impact the current level of service Austin Water provides. Of the seven pumps at the medium service pump station only four are now operable. The four remaining pumps and motors are in poor working condition and can fail at any time. The original pump equipment manufacturer is no longer in business making it very difficult to obtain parts and maintenance support. Should a failure of any one of the four operating pumps occur pumping capacity of the plant would be significantly reduced resulting in the City's inability to satisfy peak water demands required by the Central and North Austin Service Areas. This failure could reduce pressures below the minimums required for Fire Safety as well as leave City customers with low water pressure. Additionally there is a high risk for major leaks to occur flooding the station resulting in an extended outage of the Water Treatment Plant.

Due to the potential for unforeseen conditions or utility conflicts, a 5% contingency in funding has been included to allow for the expeditious processing of any change orders. A contingency is an additional amount of money added to the construction budget to cover any unforeseen construction costs associated with the project. This contract will include award of one alternate bid item to allow for the replacement of pump motors at the high service pump station.

The contract allows 1,215 calendar days for substantial completion of this project. This project is located within zip code 78731 (District 10). This project will be managed by the Public Works Department.
