Authorize negotiation and execution of a contract through the Houston-Galveston Area Council with TOTER INCORPORATED for refuse and recycling containers in an amount not to exceed \$886,870.

Amount and Source of Funding

Funding in the amount of \$886,870 is available in the Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Capital Budget of Austin Resource Recovery.

For the goods and services required for this contract, there were insufficient subcontracting opportunities; therefore, no subcontracting goals were established. Additional Backup Information

The contract is for the purchase and delivery of residential containers including lid graphics with radio-frequency identification tags for the Austin Resource Recovery Department (ARR). The containers are to be issued for the ARR Pay-As-You-Throw Program, which requires ARR customers to use City-issued containers for the removal of residential garbage and recycling.

The purchase of these containers is necessary to provide ARR with a sufficient supply of 24, 32, 64 and 96-gallon trash and recycling containers readily available to replace existing customers' broken containers and to issue new containers to new customers.
