Authorize award and execution of a construction contract with MUNIZ CONCRETE & CONTRACTING INC. for the East 7th Street and Pleasant Valley Intersection Improvements project in the amount of \$346,179.70 plus a \$17,308.99 contingency, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$363,488.69.

Additional Backup Information

The street pavers located in the East 7th Street and Pleasant Valley Road intersection and crosswalks are failing and becoming an ongoing maintenance issue. The pavers were installed in 2011 as part of the East 7th Street Improvements project and began shifting and settling in 2012. The City is pursuing claims against both the design consultant and contractor for the cost of correction. This project will remove the failing pavers, prepare the underlying surface, and install approximately 1,200 square yards of colored concrete paving that will be stamped.

On February 17, 2016 the project team met with area stakeholders at the Parque Zaragoza Recreation Center to discuss project highlights, residential impacts, and answer community questions. The project team will send weekly emails and post status updates on the Public Works Department website once construction begins to keep stakeholders informed.

The intersection continues to deteriorate and should be replaced as soon as possible to mitigate adverse impact to the traveling public.

Due to the potential for unknown subsurface conditions, a 5% contingency in funding has been included to allow for the expeditious processing of any change orders. A contingency is an additional amount of money added to the construction budget to cover any unforeseen construction costs associated with the project.

The contract allows 70 calendar days for completion of this project. This project is located within zip code 78702 (District 3). The project will be managed by the Public Works Department.
