Additional Backup Information

Chapter 26 of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Code provides that the use of parkland for non-park purposes may be approved upon a finding that there is no feasible and prudent alternative to the use of this land and that all reasonable planning has been done to minimize harm to such land.

The Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority's Board has authorized the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority (CTRMA) to undertake and complete a transportation project generally described as the Bergstrom Expressway (183 South) from US 290 at Springdale/Manor Road to SH 71 near Austin-Bergstrom International Airport. The City possesses utility infrastructure that is or may be in conflict with the proposed Bergstrom Expressway.

Approximately 3.357 acres of parkland will be designated for a permanent water and wastewater use for installation of approximately 2,400 linear feet of 12-inch water line, 2,480 linear feet of 24-inch water line, 2,480 linear feet of 36-inch wastewater gravity line, and 2,480 linear feet of 36-inch wastewater force main.

Approval of the use of parkland is made on the condition that all restoration is completed in accordance with the Standard Specifications and Construction Standards of the City of Austin and the Parks and Recreation Department's "Construction in Parks Specifications". The Austin Water Utility Department is required to pay all costs associated with the restoration and tree mitigation as part of the site restoration process.

There is no feasible and prudent alternative to the use of the dedicated parkland which includes all reasonable planning to minimize harm to such lands. The dates of public notification in the *Austin American-Statesman* are May 15, 22 and 29, 2016.
