PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1949 duplex.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled stone-veneered duplex with single 8:8 Colonial Revival-styled windows; shed-roofed entry hood at the front door to each duplex unit.

RESEARCH


The duplex was built in 1949 by Elsie Hampton, the widow of Warren Hampton, who was a shoe repairman living on E. Mary Street. Elsie Hampton was a school teacher living on a rural route near Austin at the time she built this duplex. Both sides of the duplex had a relatively high turnover in tenants, which included a city policeman, a tool and die maker, an estimator for the Steck Company, a hostess at the Stephen F. Austin Hotel, retired widows, and a maintenance engineer at the Sheraton Crest.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use to the greatest extent possible, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The duplex has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark but is a good example of post-World War II duplex housing, and is located in a neighborhood with a potential historic district.
