Authorize negotiation and execution of an interlocal agreement with the Texas Department of Transportation to relocate and adjust existing water and wastewater lines for the TxDOT-Loop 1 Roadway Improvements Project from Davis Lane to La Crosse Avenue in the amount of \$1,516,735.79 plus a 20% contingency of \$303,347.16 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$1,820,082.95. (Districts 8)

Additional Backup Information

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) plans to improve Loop 1 Roadway from Davis Lane to La Crosse Avenue. Austin Water is required to relocate and adjust existing water and wastewater utilities as necessary to prevent conflict with the proposed TxDOT roadway improvements. The proposed highway improvements will necessitate the relocation of approximately 23 linear feet of 12-inch water lines, 377 linear feet of 16-inch water lines, 1478 linear feet of 24-inch water lines including valves, fire hydrants, and 300 linear feet of 15-inch wastewater lines (Infrastructure). All construction dates are dependent upon TxDOT letting and is tentatively scheduled to begin in September 2016.

This agreement provides the terms by which the City will fund the relocation and adjustment of the infrastructure, which will be managed by TxDOT. TxDOT shall obtain the written approval of the City for all change order requests prior to TxDOT is issuing the change order to contractor.

Due to the potential for unknown subsurface conditions and utility conflicts when working in the right of way, a 20% contingency in funding has been included to allow for the expeditious processing of any change orders.

This project is located in District 8, within zip code 78749, and will be managed by the Public Works Department.
