Additional Backup Information

Planning and Zoning staff have been meeting with Vision Zero Task Force members since January 2015 to study crashes in Austin, look at best practices, and develop the Vision Zero Action Plan. The Task Force is composed of representatives from eight city departments (Planning and Zoning, Police, Transportation, Health and Human Services, Public Works, Law, Austin-Travis County EMS, and Fire).

The first Task Force meeting was held on January 23, 2015, followed by meetings approximately every month or every other month. The Task Force's work has culminated in the Vision Zero Action Plan. The Vision Zero Action Plan identifies how Austin can work toward eliminating fatal and serious injury crashes by 2025. It includes actions covering evaluation, enforcement, engineering, education, and policy.
