PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1940 house.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1940 by Clark Petet; he and his wife Erin lived here until the late 1950s. Clark Petet was a native of Memphis, Tennessee; he moved to Austin with his family before 1930. His father, Charles F. Petet was the secretary of the State Railroad Commission. Clark Petet was a salesman for a garage at that point, but soon became involved in work for the Scottish Rite bodies in Austin. He served as the recorder for the Ben Hur Temple Shrine, and while living in this house, was the assistant secretary for the Scottish Rite bodies. He later served as the recorder for the Hella Temple Shrine, and in his later years, he moved to Dallas, where he passed away in 1992. The house was then owned by a widow, Florence McDonald, until around 1970, then a rental property until it was purchased by R. Frank Davis and his wife, around 1980.

ARCHITECTURE


One-story, wing-and-gable plan, stone-veneered cottage with a shed-roofed entry hood; metal-framed casement windows.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is contributing to the Old West Austin National Register Historic District.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the permit upon the Commission's review of the plans for the new construction proposed for this site, and upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. While the house is contributing to the National Register Historic District, it lacks the requisite architectural and historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

J. Clarke and Erin Petet (ca. 1940 – ca. 1957)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Clark and Erin Petet as the renters of the house at 2517 Harris Boulevard in Austin. Clark Petet was 33, had been born in Tennessee, and was the assistant bookkeeper for the Masonic lodge. He had lived in Denison, Texas in 1935. Erin Petet was 26, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had no children listed with them.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Joseph Clark Petet as the 23-year old son of Charles F. and Mary A. Petet, who rented their house at 506 W. 18th Street in Austin. Joseph Clark Petet had been born in Tennessee, and was a salesman for a garage. His father, Charles F. Petet, had been born in Missouri, and was the secretary of the State Railroad Commission. His mother, Mary A. Petet, had been born in Canada. Joseph Clark Petet was the oldest of the 3 children listed in the census report. The Petet family also had 7 lodgers in their home, including 2 teachers at the University of Texas, a bank teller, a dry goods clerk, and a yardman.

Joseph Clarke Petet

Joseph Clarke Petet, age 85, passed away April 13, 1992. He was born in Memphis, Tennessee, August 29, 1906.

Mr. Petet is survived by his wife of 52 years, Erin Petet; daughters, Susan P. McKay, Sara Blaydes and husband, Bill, all of Dailas; son, Joe Petet and wife, Bonnie, Austin; five grandchildren; sister, Florence Beall and husband, Bill, Austin; brother, Charles F. Petet and wife, Dorothy, Denver, Colorado; and several nieces and nephews.

He was retired as the Recorder of Hella Temple Shrine, having served in that capacity from 1958 to 1974. He was employed in fraternal work throughout most of his adult life, having previously served as Recorder of Ben Hur Temple Shrine, Austin. He graduated from the University of Texas at Austin in 1931, and was a charter member of Sigma Phi Epsilon Fraternity. He held extensive fraternal memberships and associated offices and honors, including Past Master Austin Lodge #12.
