CLARKSVILLE

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1910 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, pyramidal hipped-roof frame house with a partial-width inset porch on plain, square wood posts; single 1:1 fenestration; artificial siding.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1910 by Daniel and Mary Bolden (Bouldin), who had previously lived on E. 3rd Street. The Boldens appear in the 1910 U.S. Census at this address. Daniel Bolden is listed as a laborer in city directories where he lists an occupation; Mary Bolden was a laundress. Daniel Bolden died around 1940, and Mary Bolden continued to live in this house with her married son, Hyman, and Hyman's wife, Marguerite, and later, Ada. Several of her children also lived in this house in the 1910s and 1920s, including Eugene, and his wife, Virgie, and Daniel Bolden, Jr. None of the family members had occupations listed in city directories.

After Mary Bolden passed away in 1948, her son, Hyman, and Hyman's wife Ada, took over the occupancy of this house. Hyman Bolden worked for the Tips Engine Works through the late 1940s and into the late 1950s. He then worked for the University of Texas in the 1960s, and was listed as retired in the 1970s. Ada Bolden built an addition to the side of the house in 1962 for her beauty shop.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is listed in the Clarksville Historic District Survey (2000), with a ranking of 2 (out of 4), meaning that it is contributing to the historic district but with some integrity issues, most likely the asbestos siding.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION


Postpone to July 25, 2016 to fully evaluate alternatives to demolition of this house, which has a long history and association with the Bolden (Bouldin) family in Clarksville. Even if decided today, the demolition permit would not be released until the applicant has submitted plans for new construction for review by the Commission, so it seems to be a good time to begin a discussion about alternatives to demolition, rehabilitation, and adaptive reuse of this house.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Daniel and Mary Eliza Bouldin (ca. 1910 – ca. 1948)

Hyman and Margaret Bouldin / Hyman and Ada Ruby Bouldin (ca. 1948 – ca. 2005)

Dan Bouldin and Mary Eliza Saunders were married in Travis County, Texas in 1884.

The 1900 U.S. Census shows Daniel and Mary E. Boldin living on W. 11th Street. Daniel Boldin was born in 1862 in Texas to South Carolina-born parents; he was a day laborer, and could not read or write. Mary E. Boldin was born in 1863 in Texas; she was a washwoman; she could read and write. They had 2 children: William, born in 1882, who worked as a teamster; and Laura, born in 1888, who is listed as being at school.

The 1910 U.S. Census shows Daniel and Mary E. Boldin at 1612 W. 10th Street, which is probably this house. Both were 44. Daniel Boldin was a sand hauler for the International and

Great Northern Railroad; Mary Boldin was a wash woman at home. Their children were Daniel, Jr., 9; Richard, 7; Eugene, 5; Quinton, 3; and Hyman, 2, all of whom had been born in Texas.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Dan and Mary Bolden as the owners of this house, which was worth \$1,000. Dan Bolden was 65, had been born in Texas, and was a public laborer; Mary Bolden was 60, had been born in Texas, and was a servant for a private family. In the household were their children: Eugene, 24, who had been born in Texas and was divorced; he worked at a brickyard; and Hyman, 21, who had been born in Texas and was a building contractor, and Hyman's wife, Margaret, 20, who had been born in Texas and was a servant for a private family.

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Mary Bouldin as the owner of this house, which was worth \$500. She was a 75-yaer old Texas-born widow with no occupation listed. With her lived her son, Hyman, 23, and Hyman's wife, Margaret, and their son, Arthur Lee, 7. Hyman Bouldin was a porter in a restaurant; Margaret Bouldin was a laundress at home.

Mary Eliza Bolden died in Travis County July 10, 1948. There was no obituary in the Austin newspapers.

BOLDEN, Hyman, 80, of Austin died Wednesday. Services 2 p.m. M. nday at Sweet Home Baptist Church in Clarksville. Burial Mt. Olive Cemetery in Cedar Creek. (Lois Jones)
