# HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION JUNE 27, 2016 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2016-0388 1603 SHOAL CREEK BOULEVARD

#### **PROPOSAL**

Demolish a ca. 1936 house.

#### ARCHITECTURE

One-story, wing-and-gable plan frame house with a bay window in the projecting gable; partial-width inset porch; single 6:6 fenestration.

## RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1936 by Franklin and Elizabeth Knight, who lived here until around 1946. Frank Knight grew up in Bartlett, Texas, and was the owner of a tire shop at 19<sup>th</sup> (now MLK) and Guadalupe Streets for many years. He started a partnership in a tire business with Carl C. Lindsey in the early 1930s, became the partner of Jack Stewart in the Knight-Stewart Tire Company in the late 1930s, and was the sole proprietor of the building in the 1940s.


Around 1946, the Knights moved to 1501 Shoal Creek Boulevard, and this house became a rental property. Chester Fulton, an attorney, and his wife, Pearl, rented the house in 1946-47, then it was rented by Stepehn B. and Mary Lee Price from the late 1940s through the early 1950s. Price was the proprietor of a women's clothing store on Congress Avenue. Geofrge K. Hooper and his wife, Christina, rented the house in the late 1950s and early 1960s; he was a camera man for the Steck Company. The house was vacant in the late 1960s, then rented by a series of tenants through the late 1980s, including a writer for Texas Monthly magazine, the director of a savings and loan, and a student. By the early 1990s, the house was being used as law offices.


#### STAFF COMMENTS

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION


Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house is a very good example of a hybrid of mid-1930s Colonial Revival style and an older wing-and-gable configuration, but lacks the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

### **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES**

# Frank F. and Elizabeth Knight (ca. 1936 – ca. 1946)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows F. Franklin and Elizabeth M. Knight as the owners of this house (which is listed as 1608 Shoal Creek Boulevard); the house was worth \$6,500. F. Franklin Knight was 31, had been born in Texas, and was the proprietor of a retail tire business. Elizabeth M. Knight was 30, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a daughter, Anne, 1. The family had a housekeeper, Victoria Marek, 23, who had been born in Texas, and is listed as the tenant of the rear structure.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows Franklin Knight as the 21-year old son of Nell Knight, who owned her home in Bartlett, Texas. Franklin Knight is listed as absent, and with no occupation. His mother, Nell, was a 42-year old Texas-born widow who worked as an office assistant in a doctor's office. In 1920, according to the census report, Franklin Knight was living with his mother in Bartlett, Texas; neither had an occupation listed. The 1910 U.S. Census shows Franklin Knight as the 1-year old son of Fred and Nellie Knight, who lived on a farm in rural Bell County. Fred Knight is listed as a farmer.

According to his 1979 death certificate, Fred Franklin Knight was born in Bartlett, Texas in 1909. He served in the Navy during World War II, and was living at 2313 Woodlawn Boulevard at the time of his death. He was in real estate.

# **Stephen B. and Mary L. Price (ca. 1948 – ca. 1954)**

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Steven B. and Mary Lee Price as the renters of 1200 San Antonio Street. Steven B. Price was 59, had been born in Arkansas, and was a traveling salesman. Mary Lee Price was 44, had been born in Texas, and was the manager and owner of a retail hat store. They had a niece living with them, Mildred Jordan, 18, who had been born in Texas and

had no occupation listed. The family also had 6 lodgers: Latha Kelly, 37, who had been born in Oklahoma, and was a mail clerk in the State Comptroller's Office; Alex Greenwood, 26, who had been born in Texas, and was an inspector for the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation; Mildred (no last name listed), 21, who had been born in Kentucky, and was a saleslady for a retail dry goods store; J.F. Shanklin, 54, who had been born in Texas, and was a traveling salesman; Robert A. Erwin, Jr., 22, who had been born in Oklahoma, and was an insurance officer; and David W. Hair, Jr., 23, who had been born in Texas, and was a file clerk for an insurance company.

According to his 1957 death certificate, Stephen B. Price was born in Bentonville, Arkansas in 18790, and was living at 2304 Bonita at the time of his death. He was the owner of Price's Ready to Wear clothing store, and also into real estate.

# S. B. Price Rites Slated For Monday

Funeral services for Stephen B. Price, 77. Austin merchant who died Saturday in a local hospital, will be held at 10 a.m. Monday at the Weed-Corley Funeral Home.

Dr. John Barclay will officiate and burial will be in Austin Memorial Park.

Price was owner of Price's Ready to Wear on Congress Avenue and the newly-opened Price's Store on Guadalupe.

In addition to his store holdings, he was associated with Grigsby & Company Real Estate. He also was a director of the Austin Chamber of Commerce and a member of the Austin Kiwanis Club and Central Christian Church.

Born at Bentonville, Ark., Price had been a resident of Austin since 1919.

Survivors include his wife; a daughter, Mrs. R. G. Osthoff of Dallas; a son, R. F. Price of Houston; and two grandchildren.
