# HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION JUNE 27, 2016 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2016-0316 1710 GARDEN STREET

#### **PROPOSAL**

Demolish a ca. 1946 house.

#### ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with a central, partial-width, front-gabled independent porch on square wood posts and brick piers; single and paired Colonial Revival-styled 6:6 and 8:8 fenestration.

#### RESEARCH

The house was built in 1946 by Patricio Mendez, who lived here with his wife, Consuelo, until recently. Patricio Mendez was in the U.S. Army during World War II, and then was a student at the University of Texas when he and Consuelo purchased this property. He practiced law at 1105 ½ E. 6<sup>th</sup> Street through the end of the 1950s then moved his office into this house. From the mid-1960s onward until his retirement around 1980, he was an accountant with his office in this house. Consuelo Mendez was a teacher at Zavala School in the late 1940s; she was not listed with an occupation in later city directories.


#### STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any city survey to date.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has architectural interest in that the 6:6 windows were not typical for this style of house and this time period. However, the house does not appear to have the architectural or the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.
