## PEDESTRIAN ADVISORY COUNCIL

To Whom It May Concern,

The City of Austin, Pedestrian Advisory Council (PAC) supports the preliminary conceptual plan and modified design proposal for the E. 6th Street Streetscape Project. In the interest of improving the streetscape and in particular toward improving the pedestrian access and safety in alignment with the goals of PAC and Vision Zero.

PAC supports a streetscape plan that includes the following:

- Pedestrian pathways that are physically protected by back-in angled parking on both sides of E. 6th St. maintaining clear wayfinding and access on the sidewalk areas.
- Accessible parking spaces in accordance with applicable American with Disabilities Act (ADA), Architectural Guidelines and Texas Accessibility Standards (TAS), and local codes.
- Pedestrian bulb-outs at the corners created through use of striping and texture changes to the pavement to protect pedestrians. Especially the "low line of sight" individuals such as wheelchair users, visually impaired and elderly with vision issues.
- Two westbound vehicular travel lanes.
- Interventions that utilize affordable materials like paint, bollards, etc., but do not in themselves, create barriers or tripping hazards.

The vast majority of serious injuries and fatality crashes happen on our major streets, including 6<sup>th</sup> St. despite the fact that these streets account for a fraction of our overall network. The types of pedestrian-critical improvements discussed above will help advance Austin's ambitious Vision Zero goals, enhance safe mobility along 6<sup>th</sup> St. and serve as an example to future Austin streetscape projects. Safety and pedestrian access along this popular area will also help improve the local business community.
