PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1950 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with a central, partial-width shed-roofed entry hood on ornamental iron posts; single and paired 1:1 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1950 by Duncan D. Heath, who lived next door at 84 Chalmers Avenue. Duncan's son, Duncan D. Heath, Jr., and his wife, Frankie, were the first owners and occupants of the house and lived here until around 1954. Duncan D. Heath, Jr. was an electrician for Fox-Schmidt. The house was then sold to Elmer T. and Minnie Williams, sho lived here until around 1960. Elmer Williams was a mechanic for the telephone company. The house then became a rental property, with tenants including a mail carrier in the early 1960s. In the mid-1970s, the house was rented then eventually purchased by Pete and Sarah Pecina, who lived here until recently. Pete Pecina worked at several liquor stores in town.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the permit. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Duncan D., Jr. and Frankie Heath (ca. 1950 - ca. 1954)

Duncan Heath, Jr. appears in the 1940 U.S. Census as the 16-year old son of Duncan and Ethel Heath, who lived at 84 Chalmers Avenue. Duncan Heath, Jr. was born in Texas and had no occupation listed. His father, Duncan Heath, was 50, had been born in Texas, and was a tractor driver for the County; his mother, Ethel Heath, was 48, had been born in Texas and had no occupation listed.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows the Heath family in Yoakum County, Texas, where Duncan Heath was a 39-year old farmer. Ethel Heath had no occupation listed. The couple had 2 sons: Franklin, 15; and Duncan, Jr., 7. Neither had an occupation shown.

Duncan D. Heath, Jr. and Frankie Heath were married in 1942 and divorced in 1984 in Hays County, Texas.

Duncan D. "Pete" Heath Jr.

Pete was born in Austin, Texas to Ethel Franklin and Duncan D. "Doc" Heath Sr. on August 29, 1922. He passed away at his home in Buda, Texas August 12, 1997. Pete was accompanied in his last hours by his loving family.

Upon graduating from Austin High School, Pete started his trade as a master electrician. During World War II. Pete joined the Army Air Corps as an electrician on B-17 bombers in England. Following the war, while applying his trade as an electrician. Pete also began calf roping on the professional rodeo circuit. Pete became known as "The Horseman" winning in many places including Go-Rounds at the Houston Livestock Show and Madison Square Garden. Pete served as President of the Southwestern Rodeo Association from 1954 to 1955. Pete joined his friend, Mike G. Rutherford. in 1960 as the Buda Texas Ranch Manager and quarter horse trainer. He trained and showed two Champion Cutting Horses, Mr. Bar Gold and Gay Bar Lady. He also showed the Champion Halter Horses, Poco Margaret and her daughter, Gold Margarita. When Mike changed to thoroughbred racehorses in 1974. Pete became the General Manager and principal advisor for thoroughbred operations. In 1986, Pete was honored as "Man of The Year" by the Texas Thoroughbred Breeder's Association. Pete lived horses: however his real love was his family, friends, golf and dominos.

He was preceded in death by his parents and brother, F.H. Heath.

Pete is survived by two sons, Jeff and Perry; two loving daughters-in-law, Nancy and Pat; and four grandchildren. Pete was most proud of his grandchildren. Jennifer and James attend Texas A&M University, Jody is at the University of Texas and Ty attends McLennan County Community College.

Pete Heath was a man who spoke softly and carried a big stick. He was wise in counsel, sage in advice, of the highest integrity, friend to many, enemy to none and a family man. This man will be missed!



Elmer and Minnie Williams appear in the 1940 U.S. Census as the owners of the house at 1710 Holly Street, which was worth \$1,300. Elmer Williams was 40, had been born in Texas, and was an auto mechanic. Minnie Williams was 37, had been born in Texas, and had no

occupation listed. They had a daughter, Peggy, 2. With them lived Minnie's sister, Velma Crawford, 27, a housekeeper for a private family; she had lived in rural Burnet County, Texas in 1935.
