# HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION JULY 25, 2016 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2016-0467 2408 WINSTED LANE

#### **PROPOSAL**

Demolish a ca. 1948 house.

#### ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, hipped-roof, frame house with a flat-roofed entry hood on metal supports; single and paired 8:8 fenestration with a tri-partite fixed-sash picture window to the right of the principal entry; synthetic siding.

#### RESEARCH


The house was built by Paul Murchison as an investment property. The first occupant was Sidney Ingraham, a claims agent for the Texas and New Orleans Railroad, who lived here from around 1948 to around 1950. The house was then purchased by Calvin C, and June Nolen; he was a student at the University of Texas. The Nolens lived in this house from around 1950 to around 1954. Franklin E. Gustafson, a contractor, and his wife, Ella, are listed as the owners of the house in the 1955 city directory. They lived here until around 1958. The house was then a rental property through the late 1960s. Tenants included a traffic rep for Southern Pacific Transport, a book-keeper who had a book-keeping service at the house, and the son of H.M. Oetting, who owned a furniture store. Around 1967, the house was purchased by Gertrude Miller, a widow; her son, Kenneth C. Miller, Jr., is listed as the owner and occupant of the house through the 1970s. He worked as a counter man at Holiday House, a local restaurant chain. Anthony C. Woodbury, an assistant professor at the University of Texas, rented the house in the 1980s.


#### STAFF COMMENTS

## 2408 Winsted Lane ca. 1948




