My husband and I are both appalled and angry that a statue of Leslie Cochran is being considered for Congress Avenue. I watched Leslie urinate & defecate in our back alley behind our buildings. I saw other homeless men emulate his attire. I saw visitors with children move to the other side of the street & try to keep their children from staring at the guy in the thong. I'm asked for money every day I walk down the street, I cleaned up human feces in our parking area just last week, I've seen people use our dumpsters & tree for their bathroom, people sleep on the benches every night, I've been followed & yelled at, I've been elbow to elbow with a homeless guy as he shadowed me for a block asking over & over for money — — — as the policeman watched. When I asked the policeman if he could make him stop, he told me not unless the guy "does something".

Can we not try to dignify Congress Ave. even slightly? Leslie Cochran could be friendly — but not always. He had a sense of humor — or was that mental illness we shouldn't mock? My encounters with Leslie weren't humorous or friendly. I truly sympathize with those who need help, and I think Austin lacks the determination to make significant strides in this area. I'm angry that Austin wants to glorify a person who represents our failures in dealing with an insidious problem. Can we leave cutesy, quirky, "Austin weird" ideas for Congress Avenue on the drawing board & not a permanent fixture on the avenue that visitors see on their way to the Texas State Capitol?

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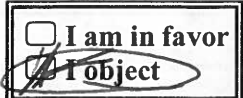
