A request has been received from Jauregui Architect Builder to construct a boat dock at 4404 Rivercrest Drive.

The Parks and Recreation Department (PARD) staff has reviewed plans for the proposed project and finds they do not meet the requirements of Article XIII, Section 25-2-1176, Part D, (Requirements for the Construction of Boat Docks) of the Land Development Code. The proposed boat dock is located on a $30^{\prime}$ Lot. The dock being proposed is a minimal size dock of $14^{\prime}$ in width. A variance to exceed $20 \%$ of shoreline is required.

## RECOMMENDATION:

I recommend the approval of the above request as detailed in the attached site plan.

The Water \& Wastewater Utility (W\&WW) hereby requests permanent and temporary easements within Parks and Recreation Department (PARE) property in order to construct wastewater improvements to serve the Eubank Acres Project B area.

The Eubank Acres area was annexed by the City of Austin in December of 2000 and the City is now obligated to provide water and wastewater services to serve the legally subdivided and occupied lots by June 30. 2004. Additionally, Texas State Laws also require the City to begin construction of the project prior to December 31, 2002.

The design of the proposed water and wastewater improvements to the Eubank Acres area was divided into three distinct areas and assigned to three separate design engineering firms. The area of concern for this Use Agreement Request is Embank Acres Project B area (hereinafter referred to as "project site"). The project site is roughly bounded by Oakbrook Drive to the north-Lndianhaed Drive to the east, West Caddo Street to the south, and Lamar Boulevard to the west. The project site consists of approximately 200 residential Lots and some commercial establishments. Exhibit 1 phostemebebundaries of the project site. Although Eubank Acres Project B area involves water and wastewater improvements throughout the subject area there is only one wastewater. line (Wastewater Line "A") proposed for construction within PARD property.

## PROTECT DESCRiPTION

Per WW\&WW Utifity requirements, the wastewater improvements to the project site are being designed as gravity flow systems which tie-into an existing wastewater manhole located in an easement within PARD property. Engineering analysis has demonstrated that the manhole is the most suitable tic-in location (Exhibit 2). Our request is for the acquisition of a permanent and temporary workspace easements for the construction and maintenance of the proposed wastewater improvement.

The proposed improvement consists of an $8^{\text {" }}$ diameter PVC pipe installed at an average depth of 12 -feet below surface. The open trench will be backfilled and re-seeded utilizing the appropriate PARD seed mixture. The average width of the limits of construction for this improvement will be approximately 35feet. The portion of the pipe from the Cedarbrook Court cul-de-sac heading north to the PARD property is proposed to be constructed by the subsurface bore and jack method. Due to space constraints and utility conflicts in the Cedarbrook Court culde-sac, the bore pit will be located within the PARD property. The bore pit will be approximately 35 feet in length and 15 feet in width.

The following table provides detailed information on the proposed improvement, sizes of the requested temporary work space and permanent wastewater easements:

Prior to construction, the contractor shall install tree protection fences and erosion $/$ sedimentation control devices to minimize environmental impacts to the PARD land. All disturbed area within PARD property shall be re-vegetazed with the appropriate PARD seed mix.

## DESIGN ALTERARANVES CONSIDERED

During both the preliminary engineering and final design phases. alternative alignments that did not require use of PARD property were examined, but none were found to be suitable The selected. wastewater improvement alignment was found to have the least environmental impact, constitute fewer tree removals, and have a lower construction cost and shorter construction duration.

## MITIGATION PLAN

Mitigation / restoration measures will be included as a part of the project. Erosion and sedimentation controls and tree protection will be installed for the project area and the appropriate seeding mix will be used for revegetation of all impacted PARD property. Additionally, a maximum fee not to exceed $\$ 1,200.00$ for the mitigation for tree removals has been agreed upon by PARD and W\&WW Utility and will be paid to PARD as a part of this project.

# Tree Planting Fund/Parks and Libraries Enhancement Fund Issue Paper 

Issue: Should the Tree Planting Fund be replaced by a Parks/Libraries Enhancement Fund?
Background: The Austin City Council established The Tree Planting Fund in 1990. The revenue from the fund has consistently been between $\$ 30,000-\$ 36,000$ annually. The fund revenue enhances PARD's ability to provide trees for city-owned projects. By mid-year 2000 the Tree Planting Fund revenue had declined by approximately $26 \%$ after its position was changed from the right margin of the utility bill payment coupon to the center in the fall of 1999. In the fall of 2001, the font of the Tree Planting Fund and Plus +1 Utility Assistance Fund were bolded on the utility bill to attract more attention to them. A proposal is still being investigated to change from a monthly contribution system to an annual pledge system that would be billed monthly to increase the revenue for both funds.

Proposal: To replace the Tree Planting Fund with the Parks and Libraries Enhancement Fund on the City of Austin Utility bill.

A substantial but yet unspecified percentage of the revenue received for parks enhancement would be dedicated to tree planting to allow for ongoing tree planting needs to be met. The fund would share revenue evenly between specified needs within the City's Parks and Libraries systems. This proposed change could take place before the end of 2002 after being considered by affected City Boards and Commissions and being approved by the Austin City Council.

General Issues:

1) The Urban Forestry Board will be asked to vote on supporting this proposed change because it will reduce the revenue collected for tree planting in the short-term.
2) The Parks Board and Library Commission will be asked to vote to support the new fund and its plan to share revenue evenly between parks needs and library needs.
3) The communities that advocate for better parks and libraries will be asked to promote the new fund so this new revenue can address defined needs not being met by the city and community.
4) Many in the community agree that the parks and library systems are underfunded due to the vast array of programs they offer and the amount of users they have.
