

The FY 2016-17 Capital Budget includes a total appropriation of \$1,405,000 for improvements to existing facilities:

Yarborough Branch Library Renovation Construction:\$414,000Windsor Park Branch Library Renovation Construction:\$306,217Cepeda Branch Library Renovation Design and Construction:\$684,683\$1,405,000

Funding for the improvements at these library locations is provided by the voter-approved 2012 Bond Program.





The Library's Needs Assessment projects were identified through input from operations personnel, requests from citizens and the counsel of the department's appointed advisory board, the Austin Public Library Commission. The key drivers in all cases were:

Insuring that all members of the community can access information and related library services in a safe, healthy and attractive physical environment Being good stewards of the City's investment in real property by keeping library buildings and sites from deterioration



Citizens are more likely to use library services when facilities are renovated.

Based on data gathered by the Austin Public Library in the last decade regarding customer use of libraries and archival buildings, a significant increase in visitation follows the opening of renovated facilities. Renovation allows libraries to restore the quality of the visitor experience and make facility improvements which better provide for the needs of all interest groups, age ranges, educational levels and cultural backgrounds.
