Additional Backup Information					

In 2011 the City was alerted to the possible erosion in close proximity to residential areas in the Coronado Hills neighborhood. City staff investigated and confirmed a rapidly-eroding stream bank. The location was placed on the Watershed Protection Department's priority list and a temporary support of the stream bank was put in place while a permanent repair project was designed. The City held numerous project meetings with the affected homeowners' association between 2012 and 2014. Staff met with the homeowners' association to discuss the project design progress and temporary support including shoring in the channel and surface shotcrete to slow erosion around a failed private storm drain.

The project will restore approximately 300 linear feet of unstable stream channel by using bed and bank stabilization. The bed and bank stabilization methods include a combination of a concrete wall with soldier piles, mechanically stabilized earth walls, limestone boulders, rock riprap, and grading and revegetation with native seed mixes. This project falls under the Watershed Protection Department's erosion mission and will protect adjacent threatened resources including residential buildings, roadways, yards, and fences.

Due to the potential risk for unknown subsurface conditions and the critical nature of the project, a 10% contingency in funding has been included to allow for the expeditious processing of any change orders. A contingency is an additional amount of money added to the construction budget to cover any unforeseen construction costs associated with the project.

A delay in this project could threaten a multi-family building and other residential infrastructure due to the current condition of the stream bank and the erosion threat.

The contract allows 365 calendar days for completion of this project. This project is located within zip code 78752 (District 1). This project will be managed by the Public Works Department.
