PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1952 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled brick-veneered frame house with an extended eave serving as an entry hood; multi-light casement windows with various modern windows on the sides. The one-car garage has been filled in and has a set of 6:6 vinyl windows.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1952 by Walter Carrington, a local home-builder. The first owners and occupants were Louis and Frances Tiemann; he was a salesman who then became an agent for Prudential Insurance. The Tiemanns lived here from around 1952 to around 1953. Ross and Rose Hardwick are listed as the owners and occupants of the house from around 1953 to around 1960. Ross Hardwick was a butcher. The house then became a rental property for many years, with tenants including an air conditioning man, a salesman, a car mechanic, a brick layer, and a library employee.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance necessary for designation as a historic landmark.
