RESEARCH


The house was built in 1951 by Roman Gutierrez and his wife, Frances. Roman Gutierrez had previously lived in Zapata, Texas, where he worked on his widowed mother's farm. In Austin, he worked as a carpenter. He and Frances lived here until around 1980. The house was then purchased by Alex and Linda Hernandez. Alex Hernandez was a shoe repair man.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house does not appear in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use, then relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance necessary for designation as an individual landmark.

Roman and Frances Gutierrez (ca. 1951 – ca. 1980)

Roman Gutierrez appears in the 1940 U.S. Census as the 27-year old son of Josefa R. Gutierrez, a 50-year old widow, of Zapata, Texas. Roman had been born in Texas and is listed as a farmer. His Mexican-born mother had no occupation listed. Roman was the oldest of Josefa Gutierrez' 6 children listed in the census report.

She was a good wife, a wonderful mother, a special grandmother, and a friend.
