- Malcom Yeatts Shared his priorities for improving cycling connections at Roy G. Guerrero Park in the
  interim time before the structurally destroyed bridge over the actively eroding channel is replaced
  there. These included posting maps on social media, posting signage within the park itself, and applying
  for a grant to improve a low water crossing in the park.
- Rheannon Cunningham Cunningham will be the first Austin Police Department (APD) officer dedicated
  to bicycle safety, and will be initially focusing on actively enforcing vehicle passing distances to ensure
  cyclist safety.

#### 4. Items from Community:

A. Community First! Village Bicycle Hub and connections to Southern Walnut Creek
Trail – Discussion and Possible Action

Christopher Stanton, Executive Director & Founder of Ghisallo Cycling Initiative, gave the BAC an update on the bicycle maintenance space and lending library located at the Community First! Village in northeast Austin. BAC members discussed the lack of bicycle facilities along Decker Lane and Loyola Lane to connect the community to the Southern Walnut Creek Trail. BAC members collaborated to draft recommendation language in support of Travis County systematically planning for bicycling in unincorporated areas, such as connecting the Community First! Village to the Southern Walnut Creek Trail via Loyola Lane.

#### 5. Items from BAC:

### A. The Grove at Shoal Creek- Discussion and Possible Action

A presentation was made by Robert Deegan of Norris Design, Garrett Martin of ARG Bull Creek, and Jeff Howard of McLean & Howard which focused on the connectivity and mobility elements of the proposed development. The presentation can be found here:

Members of the BAC discussed the bicycle and pedestrian facilities included in the plans for the proposed development, focusing on ways that pedestrian and bicycle access, mobility and safety could be further improved.

Tom Wald brought forth draft recommendation language in support of "the planned unit development (PUD) with the following understanding: That the developer include an 8' shared-use bike-pedestrian path and 7' on street protected bike lane along Bull Creek Road adjacent to the development, and that the developer and City of Austin will revisit the BAC prior to site plan approval to determine the most preferred configuration for northbound bicycle traffic on Bull Creek Road, up to and including the intersection at 45th street. The BAC supports protected bikeways on both sides of Jackson Avenue."

**Action taken:** The recommendation passed unanimously on Tom Wald's motion and Miller Nuttle's second. The recommendation can be found here:

# B. Proposed November 2016 Mobility Bond Program – Discussion and Possible Action

Members of the BAC discussed the City Council <u>resolution</u> from June 23rd that directed the City Manager to develop recommended proposition language for council consideration by August 11, 2016 for placement on the November 2016 ballot, as well as and the Pedestrian Advisory Council's <u>recommendation</u> regarding the proposed bond program passed on July 5th.

Tom Thayer brought forth draft recommendation language in support of recommending that all corridor and highway projects included in the bond package improve bicycle safety and mobility and be built as Complete Streets in compliance with the City of Austin's Complete Streets ordinance.
